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## FUMC GAINESVILLE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

**28 March 2017, 6:00 PM**

**Welcome, Opening Prayer, and Devotion :** Dan Greathouse.

**Minutes:** The minutes from the meeting on 24 January 2016 were approved as presented..

**New Business:** Kevin Johnson gave a review of his experiences in visiting our sister church, La Moza, Cuba. He said that the Church had about 80 persons in attendance most Sundays. Kevin said that over the past year our Church gave \$100 per month to La Moza to help support their work. Kevin indicated that a dinner program about Cuba is planned for Sunday, April 23. Some discussion of raising the amount our Church will give this year; the result was a motion by Lynda Knight, seconded by Joe Ward, to empower the Finance Committee to make the final decision about whether to raise the amount given, and if so, how much for our Church to give. The motion passed unanimously.

Mary Kilgour handed out a written page on our policy on fundraising in our Church. She presented the document as a recommendation from the Finance Committee. It was approved unanimously, and a copy is attached (attachment No. 1) at the end of the minutes.

Joe Ward, Chairman of Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee, said a person has been hired to fill each of the two previously open positions, a financial position and a secretarial position. The SPPRC committee has interviewed some of the applicants for the Director of Music Ministries position that is open, and more applicants likely will be interviewed. Joe handed out a short summary of committee activities (attachment No. 2).

Kevin Johnson talked briefly about the initiative from the North Central District of the Florida Conference called "From the steeple to the Streets" designed to get church members in greater interaction with the community. A statement he passed out is attached (attachment No. 3) at the end of the minutes.

John Bevis, Chair of Trustees, reported that some pews in the sanctuary have been shortened in order to provide greater access for a wheelchair user. John said that some thinking is underway about the possibility of some kind of elevator access to the upper floors in Epworth and Bell Hall and a possible wheelchair ramp for the stairs in Epworth Hall.

No further actions were taken and the meeting was closed by prayer.

## POLICY ON FUMC FUNDRAISING

The Finance Committee approves all new fundraising activity. It is the goal of our Church to finance its ministries through the regular budget that reflects the Church's priorities and which is supported through regular pledging *and* non-pledged giving. To subject fundraising to the same rigor as items in the budget and to avoid excessive demands on donors, appreciating that donating to a particular appeal could well affect giving to the budget, new fundraising requests must be presented to the Finance Committee in writing. The request should state the reason for the fundraiser, the amount sought and the time frame. The timing should not conflict with current approved fundraisers, as shown below.

## Staff Parish Relations Committee Report

March 28, 2017

The Staff Parish Relations **Committee met on March 21~**. The Chair thanked the members of the Exit Interview Committee for their fine work getting feedback from Kyle Webber regarding his resignation. The Committee also reviewed the latest draft of the Policies and Procedures, made some minor changes and agreed that the document should be passed on to the HR expert at the Conference level.

The other major item of business was to provide the entire committee with the progress being made to fill the Director of Music Ministries opening. The Chair reported that we had received over sixty applications and that the subcommittee was carefully screening each applicant's paperwork. Six candidates had been interviewed as of the meeting, but the Chair reported that the interview committee would probably have at least one more night of interviews.

### Attachment No. 3 From the Steeple to the Streets

Each Sunday in the churches of the North Central District of the Florida Conference, an average of 13628 people gather for the worship of God.
